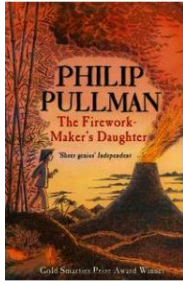
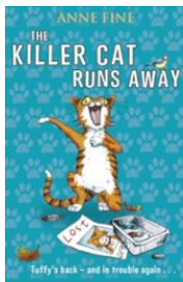

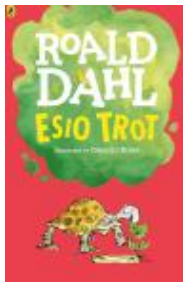
1. The Firework Maker's Daughter by Phillip Pullman

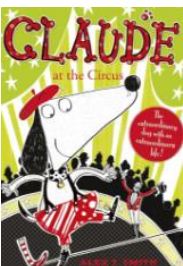
3. Esio Trot by Roald Dahl

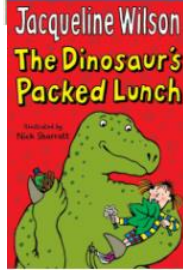


5. Claude At The Circus by Alex T Smith

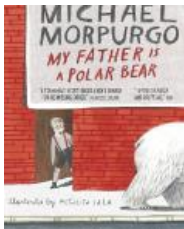

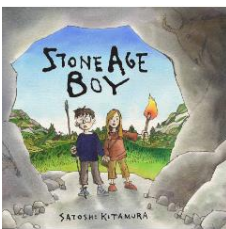
6. Happy Mouseday by Dick King-Smith
